5-Day Tour Report

Duration: 25 November 2025 – 30 November 2025

Route: Hamirpur (Himachal Pradesh) → Jaipur (Rajasthan)

Introduction

This report documents a 5-day educational and cultural tour undertaken from Hamirpur to Jaipur between 25 November 2025 and 30 November 2025. Organized by the department of Geography, which was headed by Prof. Arun Sir. The journey aimed to provide participants with exposure to historical landmarks, geographical significance, cultural heritage, and modern developments in Rajasthan, while fostering team spirit and experiential learning.

Objectives

- To explore the rich cultural and architectural heritage of Jaipur.
- To gain insights into Rajasthan's history, traditions, and art forms.
- To encourage collaborative learning and group interaction.
- To provide practical exposure complementing classroom knowledge.

- To develop an understanding of geographical perspectives including location, place, region, and environment.
- To analyse spatial patterns and processes shaping human and physical landscapes.

- To apply geographical concepts to real-world scenarios encountered during the tour.
- To enhance skills in map reading, spatial analysis, and geographical data interpretation.

Participants

The tour included 37 students and faculty members from Hamirpur, representing diverse academic backgrounds and interests.

Significance

This tour served as an opportunity to blend academic learning with cultural immersion. Jaipur, known as the “Pink City,” offered a vibrant mix of historical monuments, local crafts, and modern attractions, making it an ideal destination for holistic exposure.

Time of Departure

The tour departed from G.C Hamirpur in the evening at 6:40 PM on 25 November 2025. Our honourable Principal sir gave us some valuable advices and instructions to follow during the trip. This timing was chosen to maximize night hours for travel , ensuring participants could make the most of each day. Day 1 Tour Report – Jaipur Heritage Circuit

Itinerary Overview

- Destinations Covered: City Palace → Jantar Mantar → Hawa Mahal → Albert Hall Museum.
- Theme of the Day: Royal heritage, scientific marvels, architectural beauty, and cultural treasures
- Travel Mode: on foot /auto (short distances within Jaipur city)
- Duration: Full-day sightseeing (approx. 12:00 PM – 5:30 PM)

10:00 AM – 11:30 AM

We reached the hotel by 10:00 AM . The hotel name is Simla Hotel. Everyone settled into their accommodation. We got ample amount of time to get fresh up and have breakfast. After that we gathered outside the hotel where we planned the destinations for the day.

9:00 AM – City Palace

- Entry: Began the day at the City Palace, the heart of Jaipur's royal legacy.
- Highlights Observed:
 - The entry gate and the cannons placed on each side
 - Experience: A perfect introduction to Jaipur's regal past, with ornate courtyards and gateways.
- Duration: 30 mins

1:20 PM – Jantar Mantar

- Entry: Walked across from City Palace to Jantar Mantar, UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Highlights Observed:
- Samrat Yantra: World's largest stone sundial.

Yantra Raj: Stereographic projection on pane of equator . For observing altitudes and hence finding time and all the positions of heavenly bodies.

Dhruvdarshak Pattika: It is in the form of a small trapezoidal structure whose upper surface points towards the pole star on a clear dark night.

Chakra Yantra: A large, ring-shaped astronomical instrument with four semicircular arcs, used to measure the celestial coordinates (declination and hour angle) of the Sun and other

stars, functioning like a giant, precise sundial by tracking shadow movements to determine time and celestial positions

- Instruments for tracking planetary positions and eclipses.
- Experience: Fascinating insight into 18th-century astronomy and scientific precision.
- Duration: 2 hours



2:30 PM – Hawa Mahal

- Entry: Stopped at the iconic Hawa Mahal (Palace of Winds).
- Highlights Observed:
 - Five-storey façade with 953 jharokhas (windows).
 - Honeycomb design in pink sandstone.
- Experience: Viewed the bustling streets below from the upper floors; felt the cool breeze through the lattice windows, puppet show.



- Duration: ~45 minutes



4:20 PM – Albert Hall Museum

- Entry: Final stop at Albert Hall Museum, located in Ram Niwas Garden.
- Highlights Observed:
 - Indo-Saracenic architecture.
 - Collections of paintings, carpets, sculptures, and an Egyptian mummy.
 - Experience: A cultural deep dive into Rajasthan's art and history.
- Duration: 1 hour





5:30 PM – Wrap-Up

- End of Day: Returned to hotel after a day immersed in Jaipur's heritage.
- Overall Impression: Day 1 offered a balanced mix of royal grandeur, scientific innovation, and cultural richness.

- Nahargarh Fort


11:42 AM- Jal Mahal

- Arrival: Early morning visit to Jal Mahal, located in the middle of Man Sagar Lake.
- Highlights:
 - Picturesque view of the palace partially submerged in water.
 - Peaceful ambiance with migratory birds around the lake.
 - Ideal spot for photography and enjoying the sunrise reflections.
- Experience: A short stop, as entry inside the palace is restricted. The charm lies in the scenic beauty and lakeside walk.




12:40 PM - Amer Fort

- Arrival: Late morning, proceeded to Amer Fort, about 11 km from Jaipur city.
- Highlights:
 - Grand Rajput architecture with red sandstone and marble.
 - Explored Diwan-i-Aam, Diwan-i-Khas, Sheesh Mahal (Mirror Palace), and Ganesh Pol.
 - Elephant ride and jeep option available for ascent.
 - Light and sound show (not attended during daytime, but noted for evening visits).
 - Experience: Immersive exploration of Rajput-Mughal fusion architecture. The fort's scale and artistry left a lasting impression.



5:00 PM- Nahargarh Fort

- Arrival: Late afternoon, heading uphill to Nahargarh Fort overlooking Jaipur city.
- Highlights:
- Stunning panoramic view of Jaipur, especially at sunset.
- Explored Madhavendra Palace with interconnected suites built for queens.
- Artistic wall paintings and Indo-European design elements.
- Popular sunset point with cafés nearby.
- Experience: Relaxed and scenic end to the day. The fort offered a blend of history and leisure, perfect for winding down after a heritage-heavy itinerary.




Day 3 Tour Report: Jaipur Heritage & Leisure






3:00 PM- Nahargarh Zoological Park


- Highlights:

- The colourful stalls and lively crowd showcased Jaipur's cultural vibrancy.




Tour Report – Last Day of Trip
