



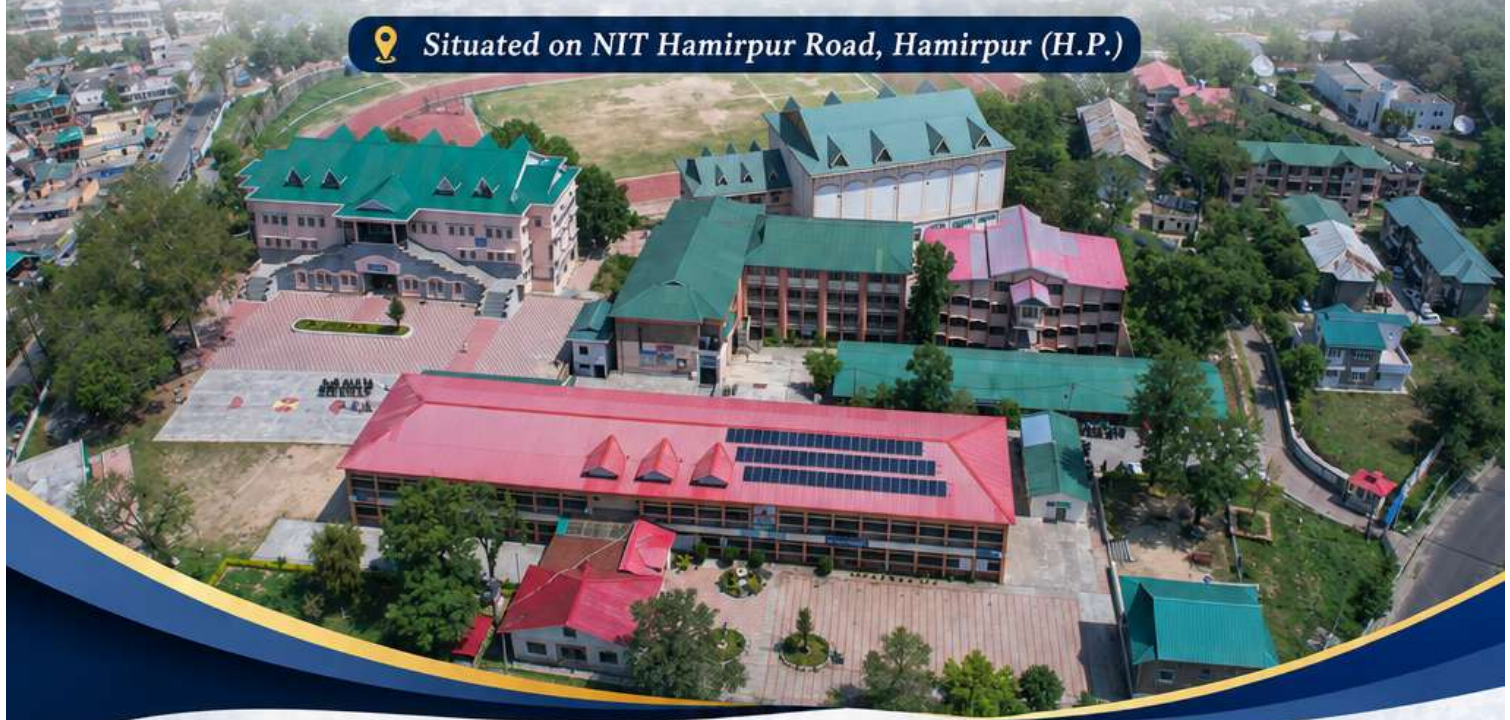

*Sir, I feel extremely honoured to welcome you on behalf of the entire fraternity of Netaji Subhash Chander Bose Memorial Govt. College Hamirpur. It is my privilege to present before you the annual report of the college. This institution of excellence is situated at a place named “Anu” just 2 km from Hamirpur town on a picturesque hill, the city of **Chandravanshi king Hamir Chand**. Sir, the entire college family heartily welcomes you, the dignitaries and other guests who have graced this occasion.*

ESTABLISHMENT:

This college was established in 1965 with only 165 students and 14 professors initially the college offered graduation in Humanities and Sciences (*i.e.* BA and BSc). Later, it also started graduation in Commerce (*i.e.* BCom) stream. Today, the college has reached scaling heights in the field of academics; with post-graduation in 9 subjects; **English, Hindi, Mathematics, Economics, Commerce, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry and Physics**. The college also offers bachelor's in vocational studies (*i.e.* BVoc in HT & RM), bachelor's in business administration (*i.e.* BBA in HR, Finance and Marketing), and bachelor's in computer application as well as one year diploma in computer application (*i.e.* BCA and PGDCA) through self-financing courses. This college is providing education to approximately 3, 414 students. I am honoured and proud to share that our college has been declared the First in **State Institutional Ranking Framework (SIRF) with 1019 points out of 1100**, and our **college library adjudged First in college library ranking** throughout the state. It is also a matter of pride for our college to have Best IGNOU Learner's Study Centre (LSC 1104) in the state.

STUDENTS' ENROLMENT:

In the session 2025-26, once again the enrolment of female students has dominated the male students. The total number of students enrolled in our college are **3414**, where the number of female students enrolled are **2193** and the number of male students enrolled are **1221** which reflects why district Hamirpur tops in sex ratio in Himachal Pradesh.

PERFORMANCE IN INTER COLLEGE AND STATE LEVEL COMPETITIONS:

During the session 2025–26, our college participated in 27 different games in both Men and Women categories. The college sportsperson gave outstanding performance and won 13 Trophies in various inter-college sports Competitions. The sportspersons of the college won 47 Gold Medals, 30 Silver Medals, and 34 Bronze Medals, securing a total of 111 medals for the college in various competitions. In the Men's Section, the college secured Winner trophies in Badminton, Kho-Kho, and Athletics. The college also achieved Runner-up trophies in Judo and Boxing, and a Second Runner-up trophy in Cricket. In the Women's Section, the college performed excellently and won Winner trophies in Wrestling, Judo, Taekwondo and Runner-up trophy in

Cross Country and Kho-Kho. In addition, the college women Basketball and Athletics team won second runner-up trophy.

PERFORMANCE IN INTER-UNIVERSITY & NATIONAL LEVEL COMPETITIONS:

NCC ACTIVITIES DURING SESSION 2025-26:

NSCBM Govt. College NCC Unit has one troop of 130 NCC Cadets and it works under 4HP BN NCC Hamirpur. The in-charge of NCC is Lt. (Dr.) Samjeet Singh Thakur is a trained Associate NCC Officer from OTA Nagpur and he used to coordinate all the NCC activities of the NCC Cadets with the NCC Battalion. Our NCC Cadets participate throughout the year in many activities and perform parades and cultural as well as co-curricular activities during important days. Following are the important participation and representations of NCC Cadets at State and National Level.

LIBRARY (1ST IN STATE COLLEGE LIBRARY RANKING):

The NSCBM Government College Hamirpur boasts of a robust library infrastructure. College library serves as a vital resource for our institution, supporting the quest for knowledge and the cultivation of the mind. It is a repository of valuable information, catering to the needs of both students and teachers.

Our library is at the heart of the institution, and it plays a pivotal role in the educational process. It is equipped with modern technology, including the SOUL software, automated with barcodes and Radio-Frequency Identification (RFID) system. RFID Security gate, self-service KIOSK, stock management & Stock verification software, Students' attendance (in-out) software, Staff & students Smart Card with smart card printer, registered with One Nation One Subscription (ONOS), registered with NDIAI (Kharagpur), NVDA software for blind and visually impaired. As part of our commitment to providing electronic resources, we are proud members of NLIST by INFLIBNET, offering access to over 6,000 electronic journals and 97,000 electronic books. The college library has also purchased books for competitive exams on the demands of the students.

The library is well-stocked with a wide variety of reading materials, including textbooks, reference books, journals, magazines, and newspapers. Housed in a dedicated building with two floors, it offers a conducive environment for learning and research. On the first floor, we have the stack room, librarian's cabin, staff cabins, and the issue-return counter, along with a section for newspapers. The second floor boasts a spacious reading room with seating for up to 400 individuals, as well as ten student cabins and a private staff cabin.

Ms. Sunita Sani was the college Librarian who Retired in January 2026 and Ms. Sudesh Thakur and Ms. Anju Bala are Asst. Librarian.

Library resources: We have around 36000 total books and the monthly subscription of 07 Journals and 18 magazines. Everyday there is a subscription of 12 different kind of Newspapers. There is also a 24 Hour section Library Reading Room for the students where they used to sit for the preparation of term end exams and other competitive exams.

HOSTELS:

There are two hostels for providing accommodation facilities to students belonging to SC and ST who are pursuing their higher education in this college. These two hostels have the capacity to accommodate 90 students each. Ms. Meenakshi Sharma (Asst. Professor BVoc) and Dr. Hem Suman Jamwal (Asst. Professor, Chemistry) are the respective wardens of the Girls and Boys hostels. The chief warden of the hostel is Ms. Neelam Guleria, Associate Professor, Physics. 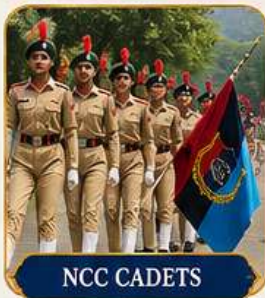
